Students in Year 14 submitted applications for various degree programs via UCAS/CAO, St Mary's University College, and Stranmillis University College. Of these applicants, 86% successfully enrolled in their selected degree courses in September 2024. Additionally, four students secured coveted higher-level apprenticeships, allowing them to earn while gaining higher qualifications and professional experience in quantity surveying and hospitality management.

Queen's University and Ulster University have emerged as favoured choices for a total of forty-two students, with one individual beginning a BA in Liberal Arts at St Mary's University College. Nineteen students have secured placements at Queen's University Belfast, selecting degrees that span various fields including Law, Business Management, Accounting, Psychology, Civil Engineering, Biochemistry, Physics, Nursing, Midwifery, Criminology, and Food and Nutrition.

Meanwhile, twenty-three students will be attending the University of Ulster, where their chosen degrees encompass Law, Finance, Business, Marketing, Screen Production, Environmental Health, and Quantity Surveying. As in previous years, there has been significant interest in Engineering disciplines, including mechanical, civil, and biomedical engineering. Applicants from St Louis have once again successfully gained admission to the highly competitive Paramedic Science, Nursing, and Allied Health programs, with conditional offers contingent upon outstanding interview performances. Additionally, one student has opted to pursue a foundation year in Art to broaden her experience prior to selecting a specialist Art degree.

Seven students are set to embark on their undergraduate journeys at universities in the city of Liverpool, focusing on disciplines such as Biosciences, International Business, Quantity Surveying, Nutrition, Philosophy, and Ethics. Additionally, one exceptionally talented musician and performer has secured a position at the Liverpool Media Academy (LMA), a higher-level institution specializing in media, music, and performing arts.

Graduates have also begun their undergraduate studies in various fields, including Physiotherapy at Cardiff, Occupational Therapy at Swansea, Zoology at Cumbria, Law with Criminology at Northampton, and Biomedical Sciences at the University of Edinburgh.

One student will pursue a Level 8 (Honours) degree in Games Design and Production at DKIT.

Furthermore, one student is enrolled in a Level 5 HND in Business and E-Business at the SRC Newry campus, whilst another is enhancing his skills through the Open University (OU), broadening his knowledge and experience in mathematics, physics, and computing.

Three students are taking a gap year that includes part-time work, part-time study, and travel before applying for university in 2025, while six other students are currently in employment.

At St. Louis, we acknowledge the contributions and achievements of every student, honouring the determination, perseverance, resilience, and maturity displayed by our Year 14 leavers. We extend our best wishes to all former students as they transition into higher education, higher apprenticeships, and the world of work.






