This is your only subject choice sheet. You must confirm your Key Stage 4 pathway (**Gold**, **Green** or **Purple**) and then choose the subjects you would like to study in that pathway based on the blocks provided. There is a Parent / Teacher meeting on **Tuesday 4th February** during which you may discuss your child's choices with a teacher and the careers department.

Read all the information in the **GCSE options prospectus** on the St Louis website <http://www.stlouis.org.uk/options.php> , as well as the following before making your pathway and subject choices:

1. **All** students **must** study Religious Education, English, Mathematics and a Science.
2. Students on the **Gold Pathway** will study Level 2 Applied Science and Level 2 RE which are equivalent to 1 GCSE each. Students will also study Essential Skills Maths / English alongside GCSE English and Maths.
3. Students on the **Purple** and **Green** Pathways can choose Double Award Science (equivalent to 2 GCSE subjects) **OR** Single Award Science (equivalent to 1 GCSE Subject)
4. English Literature is a mandatory subject within the **Purple Pathway** only. By choosing to study English literature, you will be doing **10** GCSEs.
5. **All** pupils will have non-exam PE on their timetable. PE is also available as a GCSE and Level 2 Option.
6. It is recommended that students study a language other than English.

Additional Information

- You can only choose one "IT" option – the OCN NI Level 2 in IT **OR** GCSE Digital Technologies (Multimedia) **OR** GCSE Digital Technologies (Programming).
- You can only choose one "Business" option – The BTEC in Business **OR** GCSE Business
- You can only choose one "Food" option – Occupational Studies Contemporary Cuisine **OR** GCSE Food and Nutrition.
- You can only choose one "Childcare" option – Occupational Studies Childcare **OR** GCSE Childcare
- You can only choose either Travel and Tourism **OR** GCSE Geography.
- You can only choose either GCSE PE **OR** Occ. Studies Sports Studies.
- You can only choose either GCSE Spanish **OR** OCN Spanish
- All subjects offered are GCSE unless marked as "Level 2" which have GCSE Equivalencies.
- Universities may not accept some GCSE equivalencies such as Occupational Studies or some Level 2 courses as equivalent to a GCSE, though they will consider it as part of your academic profile.

Step 1 – Confirm the pathway you will be following: **Gold Pathway, **Green Pathway** or **Purple Pathway** carefully considering your interests, career ideas, skills, and abilities. Check carefully which subjects are not available in each pathway.**

Step 2 – Choose which additional subjects you want to study from the blocks shown within your chosen pathway.

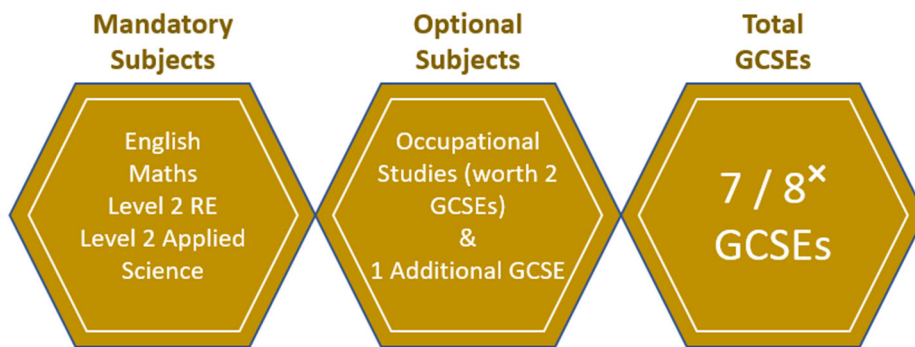
Step 3 – Pupil and Parent sign and date the sheet for your chosen pathway and hand to Mr Brown.

Please note: Where a subject is oversubscribed, for example subjects such as Technology and Engineering, we are not allowed more than 20 pupils. Pupils will be chosen on a "first come first served" basis taking into account additional factors including aptitude for the subject.

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Gold Pathway



If you are most suited to the Gold pathway due to your strengths and interests, you first need to decide which Occupational Studies course you want to follow – In school or at the SRC. The additional sheet shows which courses are available at the SRC. The Occupational Studies studied **in school** are along the right hand side below. If you study Occupational Studies at the SRC **OR** in school, you will have an academic profile of 7+ GCSEs or equivalent.

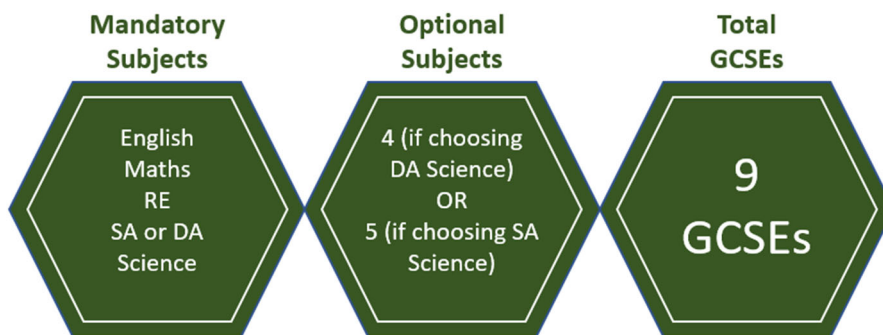

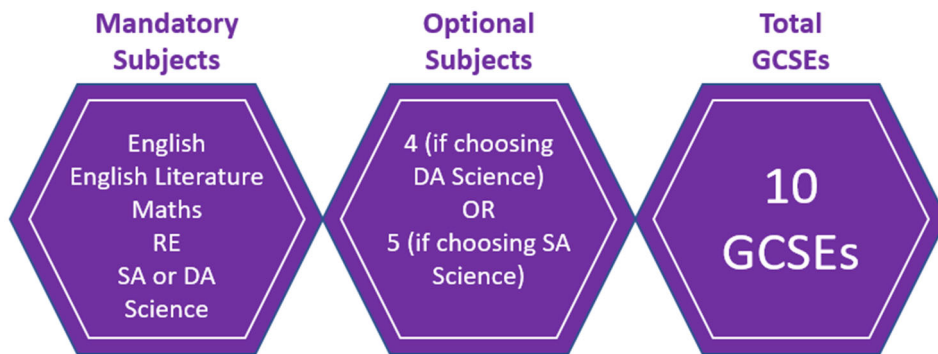
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Purple Pathway
